December Gardening Tips

- 1. December is a great time to put out backyard birdfeeders as bears become less active. Black oil sunflower seeds are a great choice for filling feeders because they attract the greatest number of bird species.
- 2. Make sure to protect new indoor plants when bringing them home. Even brief exposure to freezing cold temperatures can cause damage. A plastic sleeve or bag will often provide enough protection.
- 3. Keep poinsettias and other gift plants away from drafts, appliances, and heating registers. Make sure they are located in a spot where they will receive indirect light for most of the day. Let the soil dry out between watering, and punch holes in the bottom of decorative foil wraps to allow excess water to drain freely.
- **4. Clean, sharpen and store garden tools.** Remove rust by using WD-40 and a wire brush, steel wool, or sandpaper. To sharpen, file edges in one direction at a 20j to 45 degree angle, following the original bevel. Lubricate moving parts and coat steel with oil to prevent rusting. Wipe linseed oil on wooden handles to preserve them.
